Presentation 'Her Hair Was Made of Fog'

A.A. Murakami are artists working at the edge of art, science, and nature. Known for pioneering 'Ephemeral Tech', they create installations that harness natural forces – fog, scent, bubbles, and plasma – to form experiences that drift, dissolve, and disappear. In this talk, they share their process of crafting phenomena machines, building a floating world from fleeting materials, and exploring how the intersection of the digital and the physical can give rise to new phenomena – sensory, time-based, and never to be repeated.

In this talk, the artist reflects on how the Auntieverse has moved beyond digital spaces into physical landscapes and mainstream settings. Drawing from recent research, cross-cultural encounters, and personal observations, she explores the gap between artist intention and public reception, the politics of ageing and visibility, and how a soft rebellion has begun to ripple into the real world.
